Founded in 1938, the OHA currently provides subsidized housing to nearly 16,500 families. The largest landlord in Oakland, OHA serves a diverse community in neighborhoods throughout the city. Our dedicated staff remains steadfast in its effort to gauge existing needs and provide meaningful opportunities for our families, in addition to expanding the availability of quality housing.

As one of only a select few housing authorities in the country participating in the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development's (HUD) Moving to Work (MTW) Demonstration Program, OHA works with our community partners and stakeholders to develop and implement innovative solutions to the persistent issues of access to quality affordable housing, enduring poverty, and lack of opportunity in America's very low-income neighborhoods. The Housing Authority of the City of Oakland was selected among only 39 of the first cohort nationally (out of 3,400 eligible), to participate in the MTW program, which acts as one of "America's Housing Policy Labs", demonstrating and evaluating new solutions that can be replicated across the entire country.

Our innovative and locally designed strategies seek to:

- reduce costs and achieve greater cost effectiveness in expenditures;
- give incentives to families with children where the head of household is working, is seeking work, or is preparing for work by participating in job training, educational programs, or programs that assist people to obtain employment and become economically self-sufficient; and
- increase housing choices for low-income families.

At OHA, we consistently leverage resources by working with and through experienced non-profit service providers and other local government agencies to deliver access to health, education and social services that benefit our residents and our neighborhoods. We are grateful to our partners for their commitment and work to create thriving communities with real opportunities for the residents we serve.

Our ongoing efforts seek to invest in the future of the City of Oakland and OHA, as well as engage our community, improve public safety, increase staff development, and strengthen our business systems and operations, thereby positioning us to better serve our clients, now and for generations to come.

- Ability to: Develop and implement organizational strategies and functional objectives that are aligned with established agency goals by completing complex financial and accounting analysis, and sound programmatic assessment; provide strategic recommendations by studying economic trends and revenue opportunities identifying areas for improvement, cost reduction, and systems enhancement; supervise, train and evaluate staff to ensure a high level of work performance and productivity working in program administration in a housing authority environment; effectively negotiate and administer contracts including collective bargaining agreements, procurement contracts, etc.; communicate with a diverse community of stakeholders, including program participants, leadership staff, Board of Commissioners, and elected officials; develop and modify procedures as appropriate; maintain strong community contacts with the public and private sectors; and ensure the delivery of quality customer service to clients, staff, property owners, and the public at large.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- A bachelor's degree, with a major in business or public administration, finance administration or a related field.
- A minimum of ten (10) years of increasingly responsible executive leadership experience.
- A minimum of five (5) years of managerial experience in the field of HUD funded leased housing program administration or financial management and/or public housing programs, with the responsibility for delivering the full range of housing services to clients of low-income.
- Must possess a valid California Drivers License and have and maintain an insurable driving record.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The duties and responsibilities listed below describe the general nature and scope of work required. The duties include, but are not limited to:

COMMUNICATION, LEADERSHIP & RELATIONSHIPS

- Interacts and communicates effectively and professionally with OHA leadership, employees, OHA attorneys, clients, vendors, elected officials, HUD officials, neighbors and other members of the community.
- Ensures the highest quality of customer service to OHA staff, clients, landlords, and the general public.
- Provides leadership, direction, and training to all staff with program administrative, and finance responsibilities in order to plan work effectively and efficiently to achieve the OHA's mission and goals.
- Communicates and coordinates with all departments to ensure that their budgets, financial statements and reports are in compliance with regulatory requirements and the objectives of the OHA.
- Maintains a high level of community visibility and engagement while respecting the community leadership roles.

FINANCIAL ACCOUNTABILITY

- Meets program objectives and goals in relation to utilization rates, quality, and delivery of services.
- Directs the preparation of annual operating and capital budgets.
- Reviews and approves all OHA financial statements and reports to assure accuracy, consistency, and timeliness.

COMPLIANCE

- Ensures compliance with requirements outlined in regulatory rules, contracts, OHA policies and federal, state and local laws.
- Responds promptly when requested for information from regulatory and/or financial agencies which might include, but is not limited to, research, preparation, compilation, and submission of reports in an accurate and timely manner.
- Has primary responsibility to ensure that all OHA budgets, financial statements and reports are in compliance with regulatory requirements and the objectives of the OHA.

PROGRAM AND FINANCE OPERATIONS

- Oversees the administration of assigned operating departments and sections with responsibility for leased, privately-owned housing; and financial management of OHA programs, including but not limited to, budget, accounting, financial analysis and forecasting; information technology; procurement; contract compliance; and project-based contract administration.
- Recommends new hires, status changes, and terminations for subordinate employees with the agreement of the Director of Human Resources. Ensures performance evaluations for employees under the COPFA supervision are completed in accordance with OHA's policy and procedures.
- Ensures subordinate staff is provided appropriate development and/or training opportunities and correctly implements the fair housing/employment laws, safety rules and regulations, and other OHA policies and procedures.
- Confers with the Executive Director and the other leadership staff regarding the financing of real estate development to maximize financial leverage opportunities with other public sector development initiatives.



SALARY AND BENEFITS

The salary range for Chief Officer of Program and Finance Administration of the Housing Authority of the City of Oakland is \$205,364.98 to \$238,160.20. *Starting salary is dependent on qualification and experience.*
